Rev. Dr. Lee Earl: *Rest in the Storm* by Kirk Byron Jones

This workshop is designed to inspire and inform pastors of the need to develop a “Self-care Strategy” that will improve their effectiveness and quality of life. It is designed to equip pastors and preachers to enhance and extend their ministry by developing and embracing spiritual and physical disciplines.

Rev. Charles Hall: *Be A Prayer Warrior-Fight and Protect Battle Plan*

This workbook is designed to teach Christians how to utilize the power of prayer to create a battle plan to defend ourselves, our families, our churches, our communities, and our way of life from the unending and continuous attacks from the powers of darkness that are obliterating the fiber of our moral society and values.
